Next year they will have many experienced ball players, since they will lose only three by graduation.

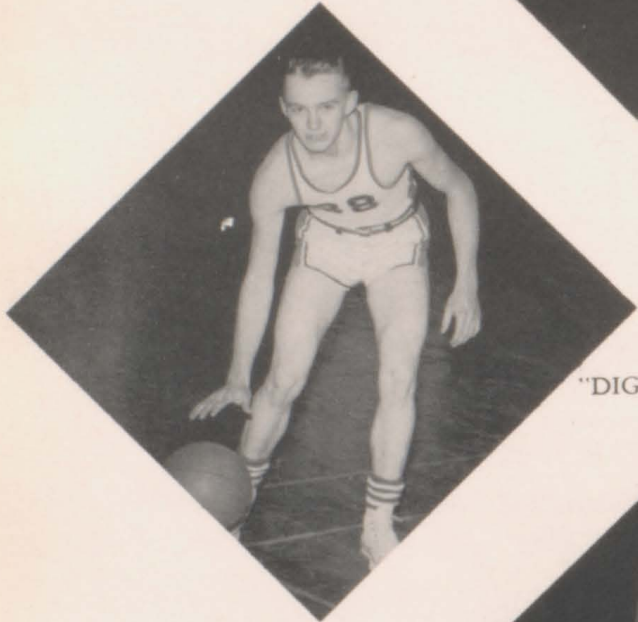
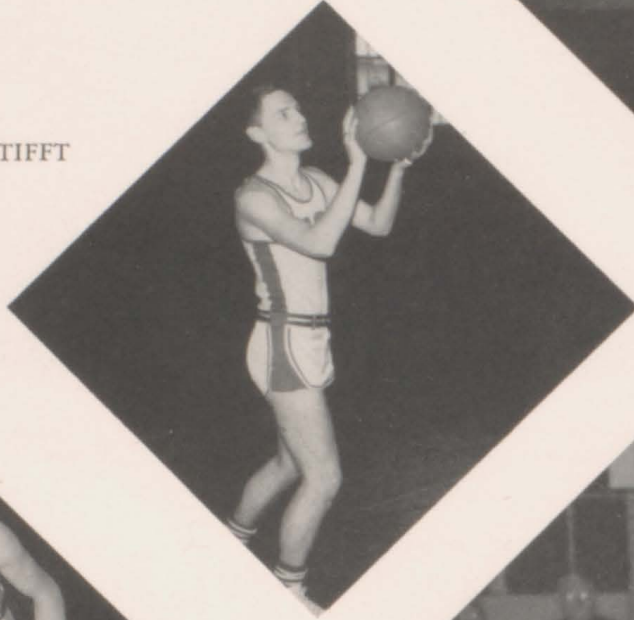

The Kittens lost their next two games to fast Brattleboro and M.S.J. teams, 33-38, 33-45.

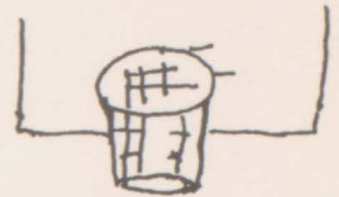
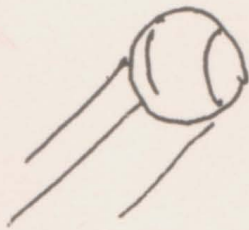

After losing the next seven games in succession, the Cats unsheathed their claws and mauled Windsor for a 57-43 win. A young freshman, J. P. Ryan came up from the Junior Varsity squad and scored 10 points to pace Benhi.

Win number three came in their first game against Springfield when the Sawyersmen exploded their scoring punch for 20 counters in the third period and then held on to win. For a few moments it looked like Springfield could at least tie it. With the game over and the score 54-52, the Cosmos' Dick Call had two foul shots, but missed one and the final score was 54-53.

Wins over Bellows Falls, West Rutland, and Brattleboro in the last five games finished out the year.

Five seniors will be taken by graduation from the varsity, but the top three scorers, Kip Crosier, Billy Kornitzer, and Art Gage are going to return to the squad next year. Lowell Heck has seen the last of his three years on the varsity and he leaves the Cats without a talented left-hander. Two deadly outside shooters, Bobby Rice and Digger Connell are going via the graduation route, while Frank Snow and Dick Tifft, whose board work kept Benhi in a large number of games also will take the big step in June.

Crosier dunked in 271 points to easily pace the team, while Kornitzer hit for 188, Gage had 137, Heck, 113, Snow 74, Rice 66, Connell 52, and Tifft 35. Tifft hooped the highest percentage of fouls, collecting a 70 per cent shooting average. At the end of the season Crosier received the honor of being selected for the Southern Vermont second team.

Next year's quintet should be able to make a good showing for Benhi, as not only will the top three scorers be returning, but all of the Junior Varsity's will be in the fight for varsity berths.

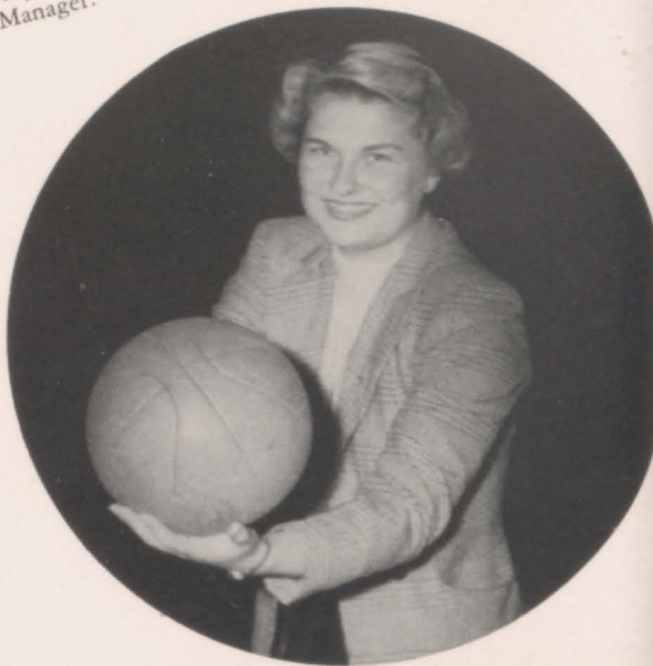

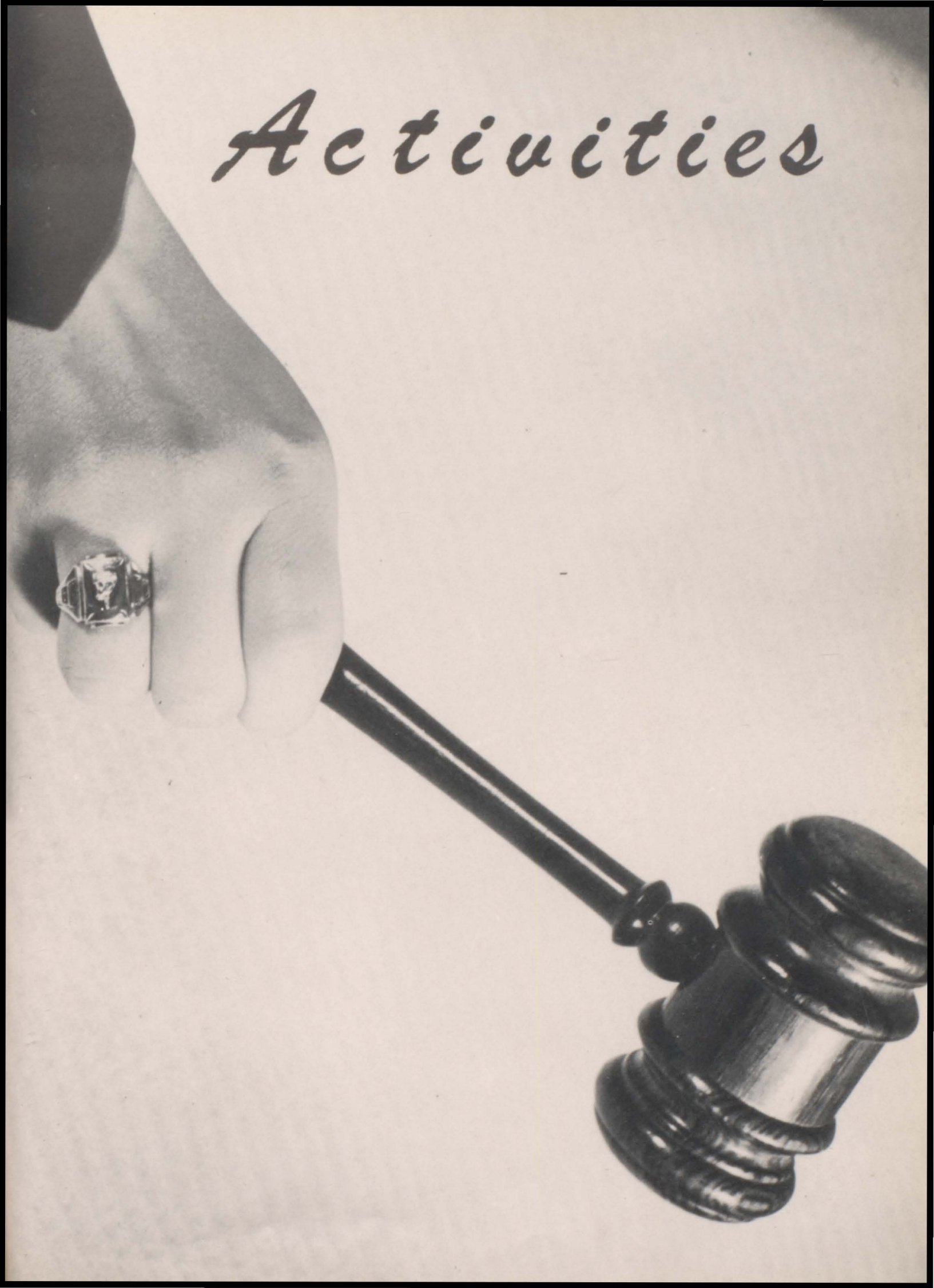

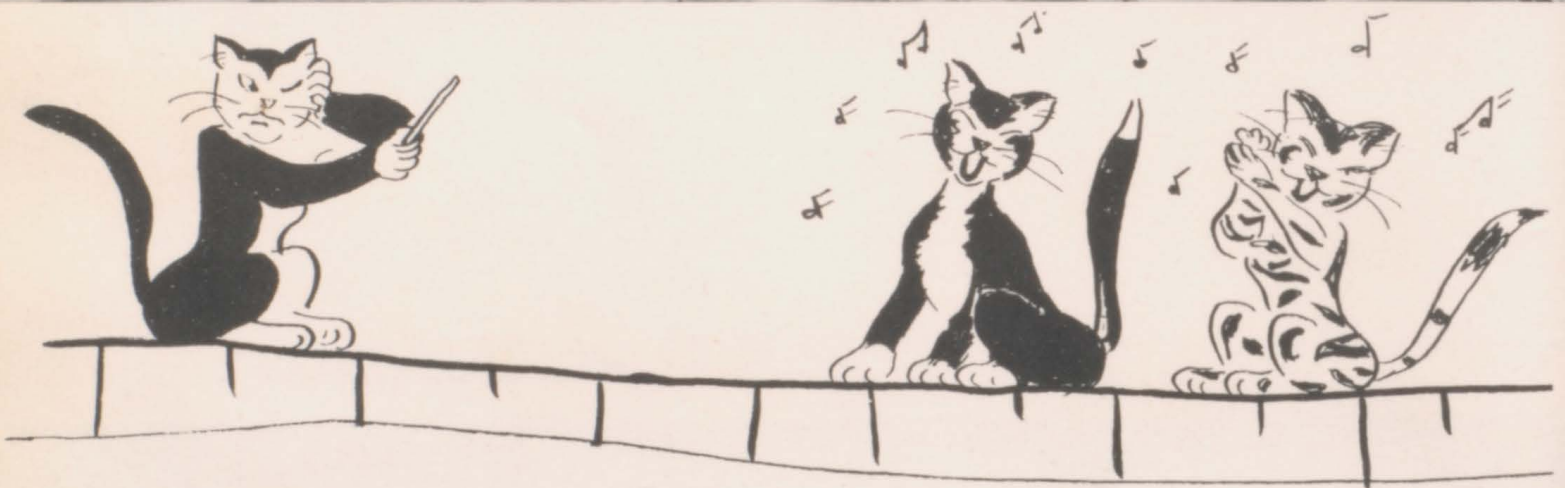

The long hours of hard work necessary to produce programs of fine music resulted in much enjoyment for the community.



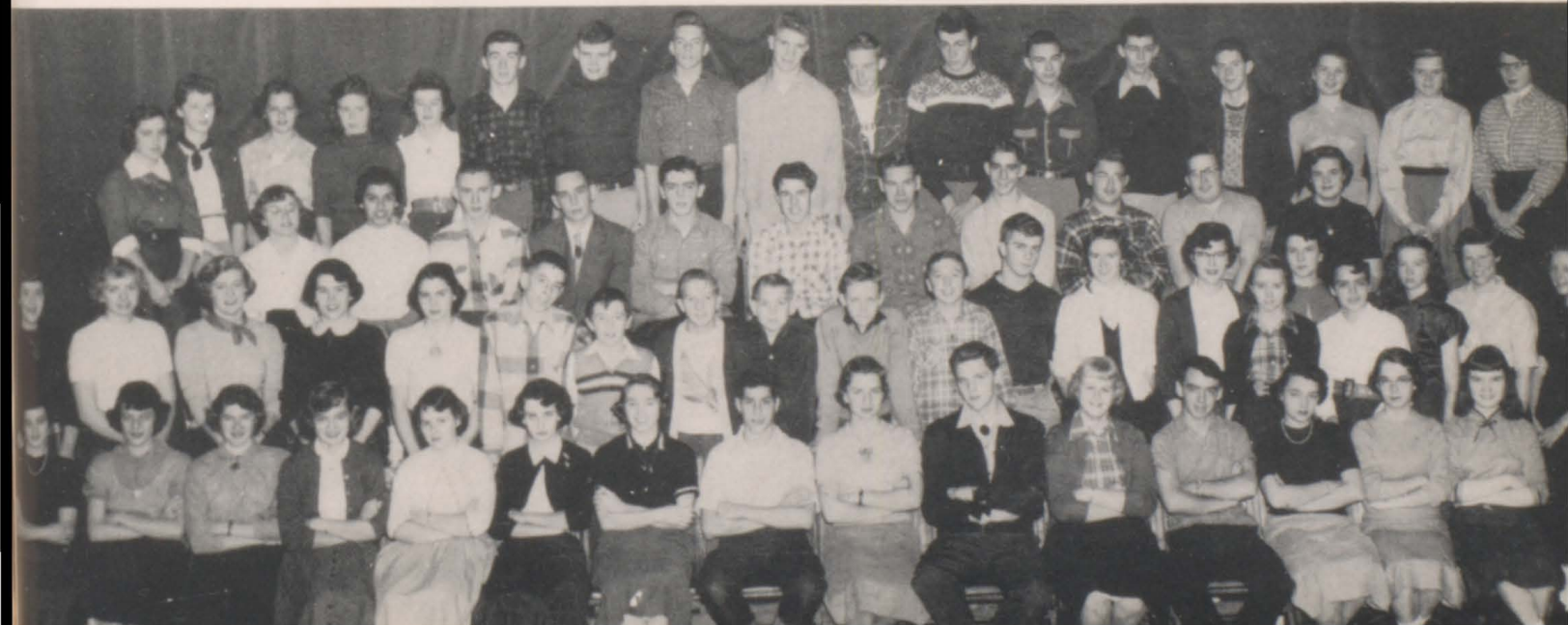

Lack of experience cost the Benhi Cats one of the poorest baseball seasons in their history, as they finished with a 3-9 record, which is far below the pace they have set the last few seasons.

With only six players returning from last year's squad, Coach Stan Faryniarz had a rough job whipping his green squad into shape, and he finally came up with four vets and four freshmen on his starting team.

Digger Connell at first, Bobby Rice at second, Billy Kornitzer behind the plate, and Al Pierce in left were the returnees. Joe Daily and Pierce were Faryniarz's only veteran hurlers. In their freshman seasons were J. P. Ryan and Bernie Dwyer on the hill, Jimmy Spofford on third, and Ryan at short. Dwyer also patrolled center when he wasn't hurling while Gary Daigneault held down the right field slot.

Leblanc, Oatman and Lacroix were the reserve outfielders, while Moore, Harvey and Pello subbed in the infield.

Hitting was the sore spot in the picture as the Cats ended with a team average of 185, with Ryan leading the stickers at .345 and Kornitzer following at .303, the only two batters to hit over .300.

Extra base hitting was almost nonexistent with he four doubles and three triples the extent of the power hitting by the cats, with Kornitzer belting a double and a triple to hold down the honor, being the only batter to collect two extra base blows.

The mound corps gave an earned run average of 6.25, as Daily topped the hurlers with a 2-4 record. Pierce was 1-2, Ryan 0-1, and Dwyer 0-2.

Faryniarz stated that this year was a build-up season as he will lose only 3 players to graduation—Connell, Rice and Leblanc. His top hitters will return and his mound staff is coming back intact.

The right side of the infield will have to be strengthened, but Faryniarz is optimistic as to the outcome of next year's season and he expects to make it tough for the other clubs next year.
